Term	Curriculum content
<b>Michaelmas 1</b>	<p>1. Critical RE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• By using philosophical frameworks, pupils will explore the idea of truth, worldviews and tolerance.</li></ul> <p>2. Old Testament – Christian Theology</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• By taking a narrative approach to the Bible, pupils will encounter the deeper theological claims made by Christians and interrogate ancient texts first hand</li></ul>
Michaelmas 2	<p>3. New Testament – Christian Theology</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Continuing the narrative, pupils will explore the New Testament claims about Jesus and make sense of these claims within the broader biblical context</li></ul>
Lent 1	<p>4. Church History</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will learn about the complex 2,000 year history of the Church, from its earliest origins to the present day multitude of denominations.</li></ul> <p>5. Women of Faith</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will encounter stories of important women in scripture and reflect upon the significance of these stories today.</li></ul>
<b>Lent 2</b>	<p>6. Are religion and science compatible?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will explore the ways in which science and religion are often in conflict with special attention to the origins of life. They will also evaluate the ways that belief and science can be companions.</li></ul>
Trinity 1	<p>7. Study of Hinduism</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will undertake a systematic study of Hinduism, investigating the core beliefs and practices of this ancient world religion</li></ul>
Trinity 2	<p>8. Study of Buddhism</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils undertake a systematic study of Buddhism looking into the history, teachings and practices of Buddhists.</li></ul>

Term	Curriculum content
<b>Michaelmas 1</b>	<p>1. Philosophy of Religion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will investigate classical philosophical arguments for the existence of God, as well as completing a detailed study of the problem of evil and the theodicies that have been developed in response.</li></ul>
Michaelmas 2	<p>2. Study of Judaism</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will undertake a systematic study of Judaism, investigating the core beliefs and practices of this diverse and ancient world religion</li></ul>
Lent 1	<p>3. Study of Christianity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will undertake a systematic study of Christianity, investigating the core beliefs and practices of Christians using textual analysis of key sources.</li></ul>
<b>Lent 2</b>	<p>4. Philosophy of Ethics</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will explore different ethical theories from both religious and non-religious philosophers. They will have the opportunity to reflect upon the value of the theory and evaluate its effectiveness in the world today</li></ul>
Trinity 1	<p>5. Study of Islam</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Pupils will undertake a systematic study of Islam, investigating the core beliefs and practices of Muslims.</li></ul>
