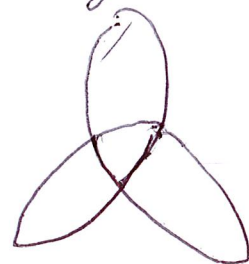
Thank you so much for giving us a taster of your school. It really helped taking ~~some~~^{some of} the nerves of secondary school.

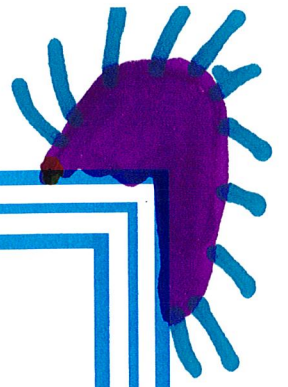
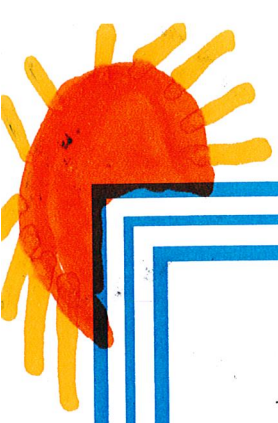

guitars.

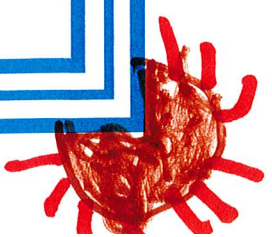
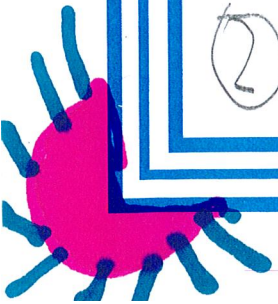
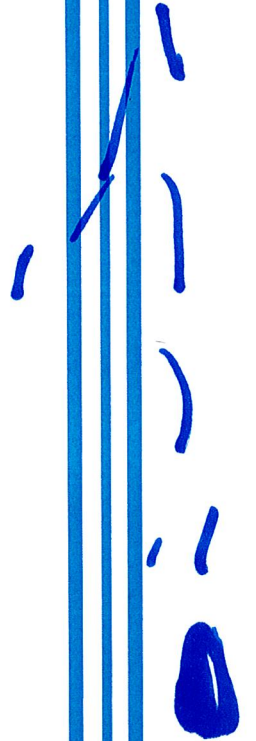
next we did some science
