

This will means that not all students will be able to develop their work to a higher level, as the teacher will not be able to give 1:1 support with their own laptop on a regular basis to all. The GCSE Art course also relies on high quality research and written work, many students have inadequate technology, especially PP to complete this. Students are currently submitted work typed up with a phone, which is not at an adequate level. Many students are not able to take good quality photographs which are essential for the GCSE course. The department has no resources at the moment to support students with this.  Students will also be able to complete homework on teams through a homework club.  Using a company with good visual software (apple) will allow for students to develop their written/research work, and their visual work with the use of the cameras and editing software available on these devices.  Each year following students can continue to use technology for catch up and raising attainment.  Use of this resource could be planned into the curriculum and especially used to target PP and HA students to achieve the higher grades.  Addition of the apple pencil to the bid would allow HA students to develop digital fine art techniques to further develop their work.
