Dear Trinitarians

Welcome back. We have been extremely excited to welcome back pupils this week and then the whole school community on Monday. It was great seeing all our staff on Wednesday and then year R and 7 on Thursday and Friday. Having our family back together means a lot to us and getting everyone back into a school routine is vital for everyone's wellbeing but in particular for children's cognitive and academic development. We were all exhausted after the first few days, but we will get back into a routine very quickly. All pupils are back on Monday morning, please check the letters that were given out at the end of last term for specific details, copies of which can be found on our website.

We have worked hard to make sure the school is fully prepared for pupils to return full-time from Monday. We have followed all the advice from Health England, The Department for Education, The Local Authority, the Diocese and Unions to make sure we have assessed risks and put in place proportionate control measures. Our letters at the end of last year did give you specific details, but I have summarised some of our practices below:

- We have created bubbles, so pupils are kept with a group of pupils all day, and these bubbles do not mix for lessons or for social time. This is why we have a soft start for the primary phase and a staggered start for the secondary phase. Please do make sure you arrive within your time slot at the right entrance, this will help to keep all pupils safe.
- We have provided hand sanitisers at the entrance of each building and of each classroom / room of the school building. Pupils will be told to use these and monitored to make sure they are keeping their hands clean throughout the day. Every time they go into a new room they will need to sanitise fully.
- We have a ridged cleaning process in place throughout the day to make sure all corridors / hallways are kept clean fully throughout the day. All areas are then fully cleaned at the end of each day.
- Lunch times and break times have been worked out so that groups do not cross over, to again keep bubbles separate throughout the day.

- Following the recent changes in advice we are going to make sure pupils in year 9, 10 and 11 do wear masks when they walk through the school corridors. This is where potentially between lessons that they may come across other bubbles for less than 2 minutes. To maximise the safety of all, these year groups must wear them in the corridors between lessons, they will then need to take them off and store them in a sealed pouch or pocket of their bag before they hand sanitise and enter their next classroom. Pupils will get into a routine of doing this. Our primary phase and year 7 and 8 do not move classrooms in our current system, so will not need face masks whilst in school.
- All our classrooms have tissues, hand sanitisers, cleaning wipes and a peddle bin to support all and to keep the environment clean throughout the day.
- We have fully trained first aiders at both sites who have full PPE if they need to deal with any one showing any of the symptoms of COVID 19.

To help keep the school running efficiently we need your help. There is a requirement that any member of our school environment must not come into school if they have any of the coronavirus symptoms. It is vital that you organise a test immediately if you have any of these symptoms. Please keep us informed at all times. Evidence of the results will be needed. If it is positive it is vital that you follow the 10 day isolation period from the day they developed symptoms. Other members of your household (including any siblings) should then self-isolate for 14 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms. This is vital to help stop the spread of Coronavirus.

We will be working hard over the next few weeks to get all pupils using Microsoft TEAMS. The secondary phase will be using this for all learning in and out of school. If anyone is at home self-isolating they will be required to log into TEAMS and complete all the work. Learning is vital. Our primary phase are also looking into the use of this to pool all resources and material together. We will give you further information soon.

The systems mentioned above are put in place to create as safe an environment as we can. Open communication is vital at a time like this. We are extremely lucky as we are a family community that we already have these strong relationships. I am extremely optimistic and our children need all the encouragement as they can get during this challenging time. Thank you for all your support and we are really looking forward to the year ahead.

As ever, I wish you the very best of weekends, full of rest and fun, ready for learning on Monday.

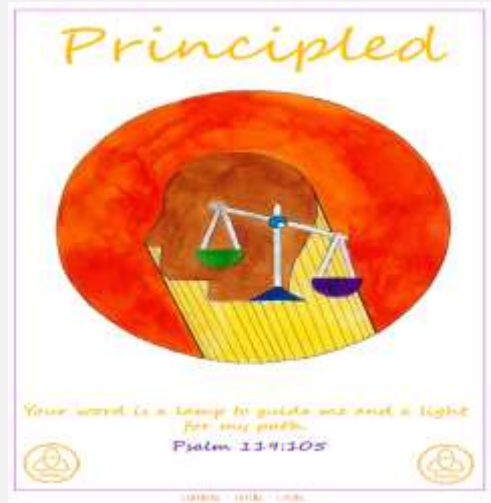

Travel Advice

Update from Transport for London on travelling back to school this September

We are working to get London moving and working again, safely and sustainably, as quickly as possible. As part of this, we are providing travel advice to teaching professionals, parents, guardians and students to help prepare travel plans for when schools reopen.

For school journeys this September, we're asking parents and students to:

- **Walk, cycle or scoot wherever possible.** Consider using 'walking buses', a supervised group of children being walked to, or from, school
- Use local **Streetspace** improvements, which include widened footpaths and cycle lanes, to help maintain social distancing when travelling
- Avoid busy stations and interchanges, if using public transport. Please plan ahead and allow more time for your journey as travelling at the busiest times may take longer than it would normally to complete your journey to school. To help with this, please check tfl.gov.uk
- Follow the advice on maintaining social distancing and act on the instructions of hardworking TfL staff, who are there to help prevent crowding on the transport network
- If using public transport, or taxi and private hire services, you must wear a face covering over your nose and mouth. This does not apply to children under the age of 11. For more details please see: <https://tfl.gov.uk/campaign/face-coverings>. We're also asking people to carry hand sanitiser and wash their hands before and after they travel

Operational readiness and planning

Buses

Around 250,000 school children use buses to and from school, including 11 -12,000 which use the existing school routes. Analysis indicates that buses will have social distancing problems when schools return.

From September, during the AM and PM peak hours, we plan to introduce buses dedicated for school travel.

- We plan to dedicate every other bus for school travel, on what we anticipate will be the busiest high-frequency routes
- We're also planning to add over 200 extra buses onto some of the busiest low-frequency bus routes and onto our existing school services

Government guidance allows for all seats to be occupied on dedicated school services. These measures have been prioritised for those routes on which students travel longer distances and are planned to be in place until the October half-term. Further bus route specific details will be shared in due course.

We will communicate the changes as widely as possible to customers including through emails, media and information at bus stops. As normal, we will not refuse access to members of the public wishing to use these services. We will monitor and review these changes to ensure an optimal level of service is being provided.





IMPORTANT INFORMATION

How to use face coverings



Safe wearing of face coverings requires cleaning of hands before and after touching – including to remove or put them on – and the safe storage of them in individual, sealable plastic bags/containers between uses.

A face covering should:

- cover your nose and mouth while allowing you to breathe comfortably
- fit comfortably but securely against the side of the face
- be secured to the head with ties or ear loops
- be made of a material that you find comfortable and breathable, such as cotton
- ideally include at least two layers of fabric (the World Health Organisation recommends three depending on the fabric used)
- unless disposable, be able to be washed with other items of laundry in line with manufacturer's instructions, at the highest temperature appropriate for the fabric and dried without causing the face covering to be damaged.

When wearing a face covering you should:

- wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water for 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser before putting on/ after taking off a face covering
- avoid wearing on your neck or forehead
- avoid touching the part of the face covering in contact with your mouth and nose, as it could be contaminated with the virus
- change the face covering and wash your hands on arrival at school, after taking it off to eat and before you leave school (anyone using a face covering will need a supply of at least four for the school day)
- change the face covering if it becomes damp or if you've touched it
- avoid taking it off and putting it back on a lot in quick succession (for example, when leaving and entering shops on a high street)

When removing a face covering:

- wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water for 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser before removing
- only touch the straps, ties or clips
- do not give it to someone else to use
- if single-use, throw it away carefully in a waste bin with a lid and do not recycle
- if reusable, store it safely and separately from your clean ones, in a closed container/bag until it can be washed
- wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water for 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser once removed

The House System gives our students the opportunity to be rewarded for efforts and achievement in all areas. Students regularly earn house points for excellent work but the primary aim is to encourage all students to get involved in the many inter-house competitions within subjects and extra-curricular activities.

If you need help finding your way around the school, need information or simply just looking for someone to talk to look out for a 'buddy'. They will be happy to help you at any time.



















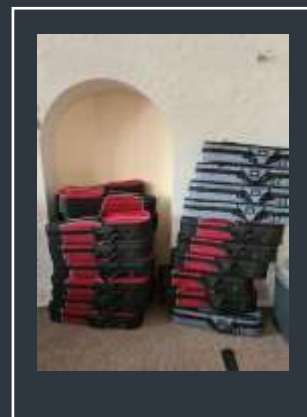

We are extremely happy to be able to announce that these will re-commence on a face-to-face basis at the end of September!

The Music department have worked very hard with the peripatetic music staff to ensure that all individuals will be safe through strict adherence to all government and music union advice.

Mitigations include:

- 1) Following all hygiene rules of frequent washing and sanitizing of hands.
- 2) Keeping 2m distance from both students and staff, including the use of 'zoned' areas within teaching rooms.
- 3) Teaching position of teacher and pupil(s) will be so that no one is breathing on another person. This is particularly pertinent for Wind/Brass/Vocal teachers.
- 4) Cleaning down of instruments & equipment between lessons, as appropriate.
- 5) Pupils in fixed classrooms will be collected and movement around the site will require masks/visors to be worn
- 6) No sharing of lessons by pupils within different bubbles.
- 7) Windows and doors of rooms to remain open, where possible, to aid ventilation and air-flow.

As you can see, we are thoroughly prepared to re-introduce lessons on face-to-face basis and therefore hope you will be confident to sign up your child for lessons.

Application forms can be collected from both receptions or Mrs Lowe. The last opportunity to hand these in will be FRIDAY 18TH SEPTEMBER.

Trinity Results day 2020



We are extremely proud of all our pupils. It has been a challenging year for all of us, but particularly so for those on their journey towards the exams that are crucial for their progression towards their chosen career path. Our pupils are encouraged to have high expectations of themselves and we work hard in building pupils confidence and aspirations. To support the schools grading of our pupils their work during the past two years had to be taken into account and their progress and attainment across a wide variety of evidence. The results are exceptional. There will not be any performance tables this year, due to the circumstances we are in, but we wish to share with you some of our individual stories that will help you understand how amazing our pupils are. They truly are Terrific Trinitarians - of which we will not be able to express all their results, but a selection to show our comprehensive nature.

- Our highest performing pupil has 10 grade 9's, one for every subject he studied. This is the highest grade you can get and is only awarded to the top 3% nationally in each individual subject. This includes English Language, English Literature, Maths, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, French, Geography and RE. He also achieved a Distinction* in Engineering as well as an A* in Additional Maths and an A* in Latin during year 10.
- We had another pupil gain 9 grade 9's, a Grade A* in Additional Maths and Latin as well as 1 grade 8. Pupils tend to get exceptionally high grades in one or several similar subjects, not often across the majority of subjects.
- A further pupil gained 8 grade 9's with a further 2 qualifications at grade 8 (grade 7 is classed as a grade A).
- We had a further 13 pupils who gained at least one grade 9 and a mixture of grade 8 and 7's.
- Around 25% of pupils gained a grade 7 (grade A) or higher in English and Maths. We have a mixture of abilities at Trinity and all worked hard to achieve their highest grades. Grade 5 is classed as a good pass (high grade C / Low grade B) - we had over 60% achieving this across all their subjects and also over 80% of pupils gain a standard pass (grade 4, which is a low C) across their subjects – this is above that announced national average today. We have pupils that also struggle academically at school and these also achieved the grades required to secure their progression onto courses post 16.
- All pupils have gained qualifications to progress into year 12. Our careers guidance and advice team have worked hard to ensure all our pupils have places offered and will continue to follow them on their continued journey.

We would also like to celebrate the achievements of pupils who left us 2 years ago and went off to sixth form and are now preparing for university.

Amongst those wonderful successes of pupils going on to Higher Education are Charlie Taylor who left Trinity with a Maths scholarship for Sixth Form to Babington College. Charlie achieved amazing A Level results A*A*A and is now going on to do a degree apprenticeship in Electronic Engineering with a company called Thales. Charlie will do his BSc in Electronic Engineering with Southbank University whilst working with Thales in their Stratford office. This opportunity pays a salary as well as sponsoring his university fees.

Congratulations to Ezra Standing who, having achieved A*A*B at A Level, has secured a place at Durham University.

Trinity is also immensely proud of our two Oxbridge candidates. Juan Garcia Valencia achieved A*A*A* A in his A Levels and is starting at St Hilda's College, Oxford to read Geography.

Joash Hanciles achieved A*A*A and goes on to read Classics at Cambridge.

We wish all our alumni the best of luck and look forward to hearing from them in the future and having them return to Trinity to inspire our pupils to work hard and aspire to be the very best they can be.
