Dear Trinitarians

We have had another fantastic week at Trinity. Pupils have continued looking further into Black History and the secondary phase raised money for charity and wore red to give racism the red card. Pupils have continued to carry out practical lessons in Science, DT, Art and Food – making the school smell wonderful all week. I am sure you are aware that within London from Saturday we are moving to Tier 2 of the COVID response system. Our school systems are already fully compliant for Tier 2, as we continue to monitor and support our whole community within the school grounds. Please do talk to your sons / daughters about the changes in place and the importance of being in groups of no more than 6 outside of school and the need to wear masks in all shops. Discussing what is happening can help alleviate stress and anxiety – but do make sure you have family time together to help you get through this difficult time.

As I have walked around both sites I have seen our children enjoying their learning and feeling fully comfortable as they enjoy their time with their friends in school. Our additional measures which have been put in place to prevent COVID have simply become part of school routine now and our children are loving every second of being back at school. This shows what a fabulous job the staff are doing in ensuring that our children's mental health and well-being is being prioritised alongside academic achievement. I would like to take this opportunity to thank them for their care and commitment to this and also each of you for working with us to reassure your children regarding the new routines.

Next week we start our parents meetings with teachers at the primary school, and straight after half term we start our first secondary phase parents evening with year 8 – please do check the systems and contact the school if you are unsure what you need to do. It has taken a lot of planning to ensure we can remotely run these events – and we do need to keep to timing. We really do look forward in sharing the amazing work your children have completed with you. Have a wonderful weekend.

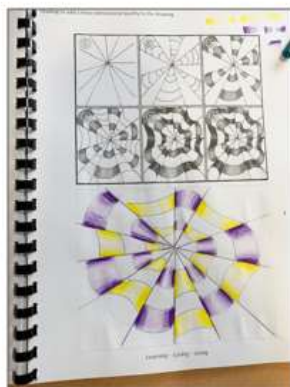
We are in the rugby season at the moment and our students are working extremely hard (following RFU cov19 Rugby rules) to develop knowledge and fitness level after lockdown.

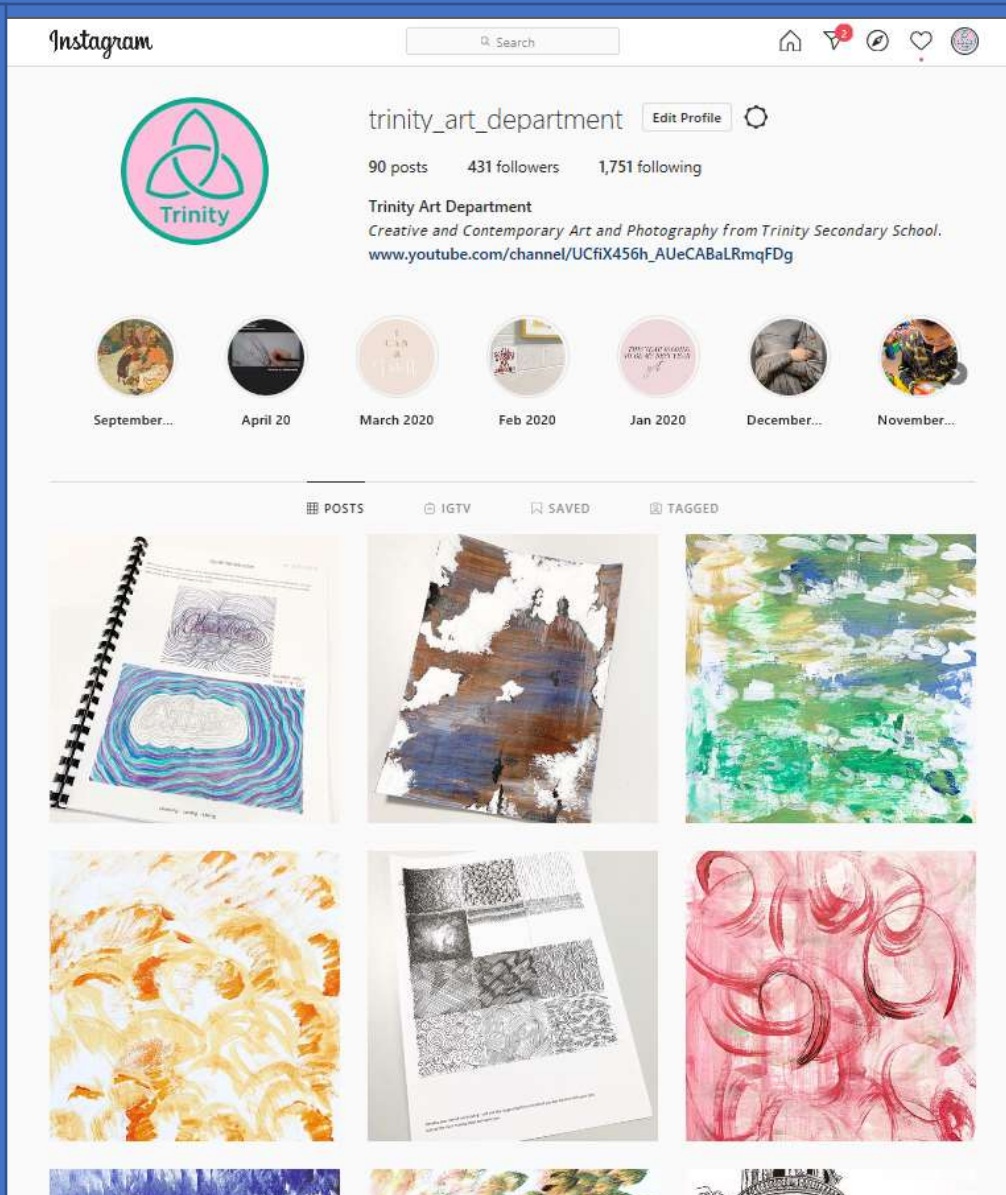

Learn about the SLG'S history, view past exhibitions and events and explore the historic collection and archives.

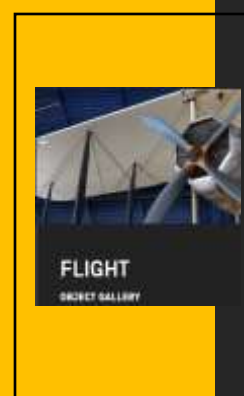
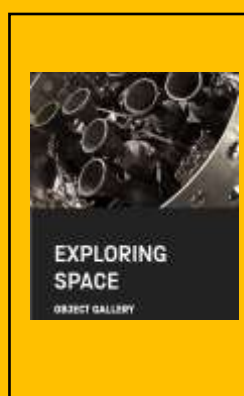
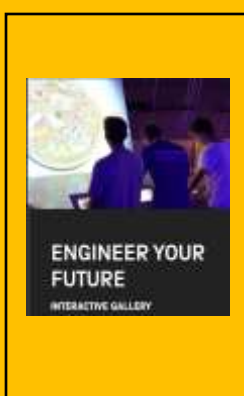
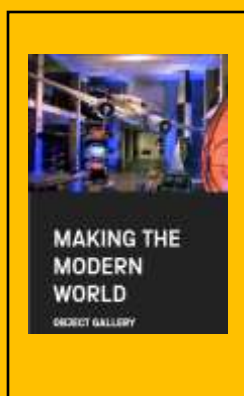

Mental Health & Wellbeing

For many years, mental health had been somewhat of an afterthought when it came to general wellbeing, with physical health taking top priority. However, over the past decade or so, attitudes have been changing, as the negative impact of mental ill-health on both a personal and professional level has become more widely recognised and publicised.

Wellbeing at Trinity

Trinity aims to provide a variety of ways in which pupils can access support for their general health and wellbeing. Currently there is a range of therapies, groups and trained individuals that Trinitarians have access to. Trinity now has plans to add to its existing provisions by introducing its first team of pupil Wellbeing Ambassadors.



Wellbeing Ambassadors

The role of our Wellbeing Ambassadors is to provide valuable early intervention help to their peers who may be emotionally distressed, need someone to talk too and responds well to those in need of a 'listening ear'. Much like the Mental Health First Aiders the Wellbeing Ambassadors are to be an additional point of contact for pupils. Wellbeing Ambassadors will help to facilitate the implementation of Trinity's Health and Wellbeing strategy by:

- Removing the stigma by getting people talking about mental health and sharing their experiences
- Raising awareness of mental health problems
- Organising specific events & celebrate mental health awareness days
- Promoting positive mental health in our school
- Signpost young people to access support in your school
- Share good news stories

If you have confidence to step in, reassure and support a person in distress or have enhanced interpersonal skills such as the ability to listen non-judgementally and would like to help someone recover their health by guiding them to further support - whether that's self-help then this could be the role for you. Becoming a Wellbeing Ambassador may be similar to the career you wish to pursue in the future.

Even without these skills still apply as all ambassadors will receive training. Application forms can be found on WeDuc or collected from Ms Simpson's office (ground floor atrium)

WANT TO BE A WELLBEING AMBASSADOR – CALLING ALL YEAR 10

HOW TO MEASURE REMAINING DAYLIGHT WITH YOUR HAND

MANLINESS



1: **FACE** the sun and extend your arm in front of you so that your palm faces toward you and fingers are parallel to horizon.



2: **POSITION** your index finger so that it rests just below the sun and your pinky parallel to the edge of the horizon.

3: **COUNT** the number of fingers it takes to reach from the sun to the horizon. Each ascending finger represents 15 minutes until the sun sets.



4: **IF** space allows, line up your other hand directly below and continue counting. Each hand represents approximately one hour.
