Dear Trinitarians

Can I remind families to make sure the children have warm coats during the winter months as we will continue to use the outdoor space for fresh air throughout the cold season. Can we ask you to also please ensure all children come to school with a water bottle. 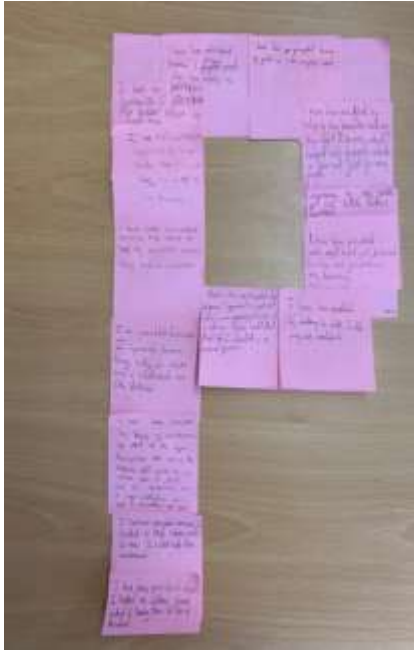
In Year 4, during our topic 'It Takes Guts' our children explore the life of Nelson Mandela.

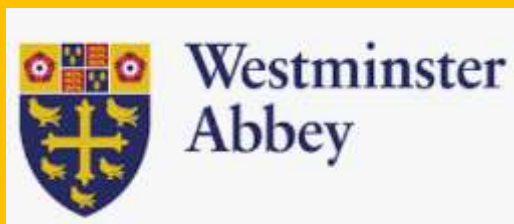

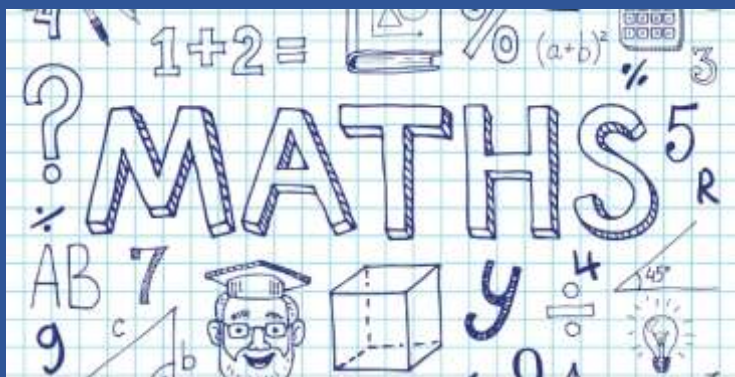
