Dear Trinitarians

We have had a fabulous week welcoming the Trinity family back into our buildings. The pupils have been fully immersed into school life and have demonstrated how resilient they are. The quality of their work is evidence of how amazing you have been in supporting their school work at home. Thank you for all you have done – it really has helped the pupil's progress. We have a recovery curriculum in place, which is why we are reviewing pupil's work, to ensure we tackle all misconceptions and support the pupils in making rapid progress.

The wider curriculum is just as important now as it was before COVID. We still need to continue developing pupil's internet safety, mental health and wellbeing, Relationship education and Personal Development. Pupils were quick to return to the routines of school life and have adapted with the changes we have put in place. We are still going to drive our Character Education and continue with our careers program.

The secondary lateral flow tests have been extremely successful. We have over 90% of the school community taking the test and this week all Year groups were tested when they first returned to the building and two year groups have also had their second test now. We have enough testing equipment to continue the testing regime right up until the Easter break. This is more than schools were asked to carry out by the Department for Education, but as we have the resources we feel it is important to continue with the process until our stock runs out. We will give them a home testing kit to continue the routine over the Easter break at home. This is just one strategy of helping to keep the school environment safe.

Have a restful weekend. Please remind your children that they must not meet up outside of school – but instead should arrive at school on time and go straight home. Let's continue to keep the school community safe.

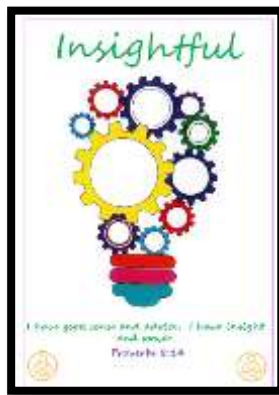


WORLD BOOK DAY 2021

Monday 15 March	God's Story Our Story	Matthew 1:1-17	People can be baptised when they are babies or children or grown up. Find out what happens at a baptism at your church. If you have been baptised, remember together what happened on that day.
Tuesday 16 March	Many Tongues	Acts 2:1-2, 4-6	God's family can be found all over the world. Does your family or your church have links with Christians overseas? Find or download a map and mark where they live. Find out a little about the country they are in and then pray for them and the people of that country.
Wednesday 17 March	Telling the Story	Acts 8:26-39	Imagine someone came to your home and they had never heard about Jesus. What would you tell them? What stories would you share? What would you tell them about followers of Jesus? Create a poster (on paper or online) with your ideas and call it "Meet Jesus".
Thursday 18 March	Good News for Everyone	Acts 10:1-48	Blow some bubbles to help you pray. As you chase them, call out "God's love is for..." and name someone you know before you burst the bubble. Finish by calling out "God's love is for everyone. Amen."
Friday 19 March	Out There	Acts 19:8-10	Cut some cards to the size of a bank card. On one side write "God is with me". On the other side write, "Everywhere, all the time". Decorate the cards. Give one to each member of your family to keep in their wallet or phone.
Weekend 20-21 March	Never Alone	Matthew 28:16-20	Draw round your hand. On the palm write "Jesus said". On the fingers write "I am with you always" - one word on each finger. Keep the hand by your bed as a reminder that whatever happens or however you feel, Jesus is always with you.

2021 YEAR 7 – 10 TRIP TO BELGIUM & HOLLAND DATES 12TH TO 15TH JULY 2021 BOOK NOW!

The unveiling of England's lockdown exit plan has got many people excited about international trips.

The earliest date people from England will be able to travel abroad for a holiday is 17th May, when the country moves in to step three of its lockdown exit plan. That's if the government is satisfied the four tests are being met.

As 25 parents have already paid, we have been discussing with the travel agency the different options we have to avoid any loss of payments and the one we are most satisfied with is the following:

Paying the full amount will mean that if UK government advice or any of the three countries we need to travel to (France, Belgium and Holland) are against international travel we would receive a full refund. If we were not to meet the payment deadlines we would be in breach of contract, losing all payments made. The travel agency will contact us regarding cancellations 7-14 days before departure date.

The deadline for paying the full balance is Friday 23rd of April.

The trip is confirmed and it will be during our Trinity activities week, therefore, students won't miss any lessons. The departure date is Monday 12th July returning Thursday 15th July 2021 (4 day tour with 3 nights' accommodation).

The Gasthof T'Zweerd and A&O Amsterdam Zuidooost are confirmed for our accommodation in Belgium and Holland respectively.

The total cost for the trip is still £450.00. **The full balance should be paid by Friday 23rd of April 2021.**

We only have few places available and they will be allocated on a first come first served basis. As mentioned above, if travel restrictions are in place you will receive A FULL REFUND.

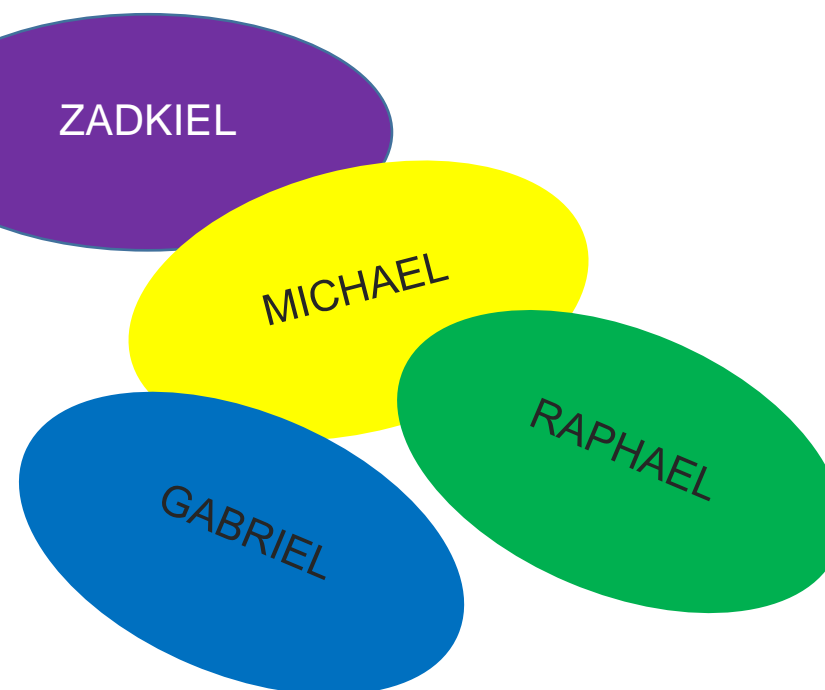



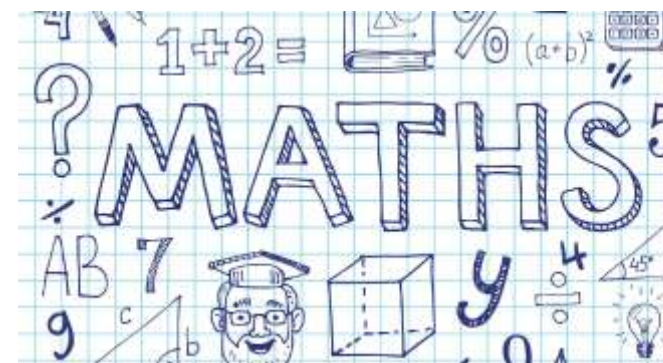
