Dear parents and carers

We have had an amazing week back after half term. Pupils have been fully engaged in their learning and their attitudes to learning have been impeccable. As you know we had a recent full school review and the outcomes were extremely positive. We have a knowledge rich school where pupils have a thirst for learning. Our school priorities remain to:

- Continue to develop our strategies of getting pupils to make their knowledge stick over time do talk to your sons/ daughters at home about what they have learnt in school, and see if they can remember what they learnt last month or even last year.
- Continue to push our Personal Development and Character Education across the school as we are educating pupils for life not just for exams.
- Continue to focus on ensuring assessment is used to support pupils next steps so pupils learn from their mistakes and thrive over time.

As our current catering contract comes to an end shortly we have been out to tender over the last 3 months. It has been a long and thorough process led by an external consultant to ensure we have followed all the correct processes and procedures. Today we had the final interviews with the 3 highest ranking companies. The pupils and staff were fully involved in a tasting session, and then an interview process. Our full governors will meet next week to determine the company that will gain the contract. The winning company will start straight after Easter.

We understand this is a worrying time with the Coronavirus. As a school, we are checking Public Health England guidance daily to ensure we are fully aware of any developments. The Department for Education, Southwark Diocese and Lewisham Local Authority are also in constant communication with us, ensuring we are up to date on all the developments. All staff have been notified of what to do and how to respond should there be any concerns.

CHARACTER CORNER by Paul Mohen & Fidelma Hanlon

Visit London's rainforest at the **Barbican Conservatory**. The sprawling Barbican complex in the City of London definitely isn't the place you'd expect to find one of the capital's greatest green spaces. The Barbican Conservatory opened in 1984 and is one of the biggest greenhouses in London, second only to Kew Gardens. It houses 2,000 plant species, including towering palms and ferns, across an extensive series of concrete terraces and beds. There are even koi carp and terrapins.



CHAPLAINCY PHOTOS - THROUGH SCHOOL FAITH TEAM MEETING










TRINITY PUPIL AIDS ELDERLY GENTLEMAN

How to Phone an Ambulance

Phoning an ambulance is something people assume is second nature. However, in a highly stressful situation, it is easy to find your mind has gone blank. Emergency telephone numbers are different worldwide. In the UK 999 will get you through to the emergency services operator. They will ask you which service you require - police, fire or ambulance.



The operator will need to know exactly where you are – use reference points, landmarks, ask locals or use google maps and give as much information as you can to help them to establish your exact location. Use **speakerphone** so you can continue to provide first aid treatment whilst talking to the emergency services. Do what they advise.

They will need to know:

Your name

The telephone number you are calling from

Your location (including a postcode if possible)
