Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." This week in worship we have been thinking about the Feast of Candlemas. The story we hear at this feast is when Jesus as a baby of 40 days old is taken to the temple. Behaviour at Trinity (secondary site)

Dear parents/carers,

The safety and wellbeing of our pupils is of paramount importance. It is a pleasure to walk around the building throughout the school day seeing so many excellent lessons with pupils behaving in such a positive manner. This view is also expressed by the many visitors we receive at Trinity and also when pupils go on trips and visits. It is important to reflect upon the fact that we pride ourselves that teachers and support staff issue far more rewards than sanctions to pupils!

However, we know that sometimes it doesn't go right for us as a community and therefore as a loving Christian environment it is important to seek justice and fairness. This sometimes results in pupils being given sanctions. On that note can I remind you of an important change to our behaviour procedures which we started last term.

If a pupil receives an after school same day detention they must attend this or speak to a member of staff if there is a reason why this can't happen on that day. Failure to do this will result in the pupil spending the following day in the Trinity Centre with our Learning Mentors and an hour's detention. All pupils were told of this last term and each day, detention lists are displayed throughout the building. All pupils should check this list prior to leaving the school.

Character Education - Flexi Day January 30th 2019

This Flexi Day focused on pupils becoming Courageous Advocates. Year 8 and Year 9 took part in a variety of workshops which encouraged them to think about how they can use their voice to speak up about the injustices in their community and in the wider world. They had time to think about how they can become active citizens and get involved in community projects which help those who are vulnerable or who feel they are without a voice in society.

The morning started with worship led by Mother Juliet, where we anchored the thinking for the day in our Christian beliefs. Pupils learned about what it is to be a courageous advocate and how they can get involved in projects which help build their own character whilst also helping others. Mother Bridget from the Good Shepherd was inspirational as she shared some of the advocacy work done through the Good Shepherd and how young people from the community volunteer at their food bank among other things. Year 9 pupils then had a further talk from a representative from a charity called First Give. Year 9 will complete a First Give project over the next couple of months, through their RE lessons, where they reflect on ways they can tackle social problems in our local community.



Envision Project with Year 1


'We develop young people's employability by empowering them to tackle real-life social problems.'
