Dear Trinitarians

I hope you have enjoyed the amazing sun this week - fingers crossed it survives through half term which begins at the end of next week. We ran an extremely successful parent workshop at the primary site using our speech and language therapist on Tuesday. She met parents at the end of the day inside looking at how sharing stories can be the best way to develop a child's language. She looked at the theory and then explored different books giving tips on how to bring them alive. She continued this outside in the playground and modelled how to read stories to a much larger audience. Thank you to all those that came and we hope you have developed your skills to support the learning journey at home. We wish to also thank all the parents that came along to the 'For Jimmy' Safer Haven project presentation on Monday. This had our very own pupils talk about safety in the community and how we can work together to ensure everyone remains safe and happy around Lee and Hither Green. This is a project we have run across both the primary and secondary phase and has had a huge impact on our pupils. Please do talk about safety in the community, with crossing roads, talking to strangers and how to remain safe if on their own. Safety is paramount.

As well as safety on the streets we have also been looking at healthy body and minds this week at school. Looking at staying healthy with our eating, exercise and keeping our minds healthy. We have also discussed body image with some of the pupils. All of us live with our bodies as they evolve and change. We all have a role in shaping an inclusive culture where we help others feel comfortable in their own skin (for more information visit www.mentalhealth.org.uk). Making pupils aware of mental health is very important, as well as teaching them strategies of coping when under pressure or stressed. We have spent the week talking about mental health, as this needs to be seen as a healthy process. It is normal to experience different emotions and pupils need to recognise the emotions and how they can support these. Please do continue these discussions at home. There is also free, safe and anonymous online counselling and support available for young people - Kooth.com. We have run assemblies introducing this service, so that they can find support on any of their concerns. Lewisham has also got a one-stop support service for the young people in Lewisham. This is for Emotional health and well-being, Sexual Health and Drugs and Alcohol advice / support. They can be called on 020-8690-3020 or visit them on www.compass-uk.org.

We continue our public exam season this week. It has kicked off brilliantly and our pupils have been amazing. We have pupils in clusters around the site revising throughout the day, before school and after school until 6pm. We have breakfast club to make sure they are looking after their bodies as well as sports clubs to keep them active and stress-free. A group of pupils have been running mindfulness sessions all week which has been growing as pupils feel it really is supporting them and helping keep their feet firmly rooted on the ground. Our thoughts and prayers are with them through this pressured time. After half term they will have only two full weeks of exams left.

Trinity Music is proud to be able to announce their successful application for £30,000 funding from the charitable organization, Restore the Music UK.

RESTORE THE MUSIC UK is a UK registered charity, which seeks to reinstate access to music for every child in primary and secondary schools across London. 
