

Firmly rooted in our ethos, the charter aims to support pupils in flourishing both in and outside the classroom. It aims to develop pupils' skills of independence and perseverance, to encourage selflessness and compassion and help build a sense of kindness and curiosity in the world around them.

Pupils will continue to grow academically while also developing their moral and ethical character within our Christian setting.

The Charter will support pupils in building their cultural capital, in recognising and developing the skills and attributes they already have and will challenge them to think strategically about how they can enhance their education beyond the classroom.

## So how does it work? (Trinity)

- Pupils must complete the specified number of activities to gain an award. Evidence should be provided and kept in their folder for each activity and a reflection note written after each experience. Family Group leaders will sign or stamp to verify entries.
- There is opportunity for pupils to complete additional activities beyond those specified in the Charter and to be recognised for that in this process.
- Pupils will then be awarded with a certificate on completion of each award. Parents and pupils are
  encouraged to complete the Voice section at the end of the booklet to share their thoughts on
  the project and the impact it has had.






