Chaplain's corner: *Then Peter came and said to Jesus, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive?"*

As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times. Matthew 18:21-22

One of our themes in worship this week has been 'forgiveness'. The chaplaincy film club presented the story of Onesimus who was forgiven by Philemon. This story taught us the importance of being forgiving even when it is difficult. The students presenting the film prompted us that we need to accept when we have done something wrong and to say sorry and to try to put things right. They also reminded us to be forgiving not only to others but also to ourselves. Reader Paul reminded us that when we are forgiving we are better able to hear God's word. Jesus' instructions from our Bible reading are that we must forgive each other over and over again and not just settle for a one off effort. This persistence is a key aspect of our ethos in Trinity: that we never give up and continually strive to become our best selves in our learning, our loving and our living.

Victor Akingbolasan equally achieved amazing results in his GCSE's securing him a Bursary place at The City of London School.



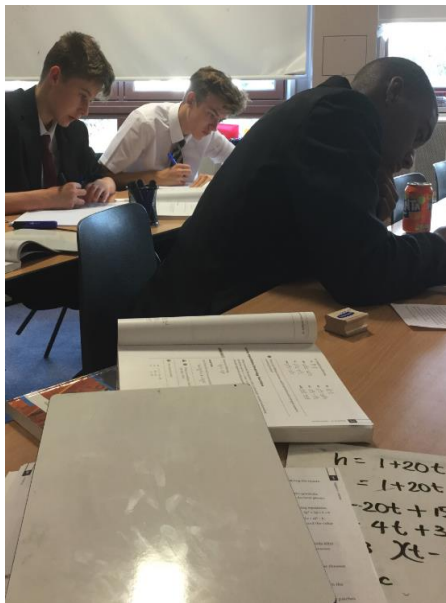
STRETCH & CHALLENGE IN MATHS

It's only the second week in the new school year but the Maths department are already ensuring that their KS4 students in years 10 and 11 are being challenged to go beyond their usual GCSE studies.

In year 10, selected students have begun studies in a level 2 certificate in Finance. A qualification that will gain them 10 UCAS points as well as valuable experience in the world of savings, investments and insurance. This CISI (Chartered Institute for Securities and Investments) course is usually followed by post-16 students and finance industry professionals and is now in its third successful year at Trinity.

In year 11, students with an interest in extending their Maths skills beyond GCSE and into 'A' level have begun studying the FSMQ (**Free Standing Maths Qualification**) Additional Maths course. This course covers the start of 'A' level Maths and is an excellent way to prepare students for 'A' levels, boost GCSE skills, or simply provide those with a passion for Maths an outlet in which they can challenge themselves. Last year we saw students get 100% A-B grades ('A' being the highest possible) which has set the bar high for this year's class.

Coming soon: KS3 pupils are not left out! We will be entering the UKMT (United Kingdom mathematics Trust) competitions again this year with Y7 – Y9 inclusive. Can anyone beat the amazing results last year which saw Patrick Meehan in Year 8 go through to the National Kangaroo? **Watch this space**.....and until then, KS3 pupils can stretch themselves with our "Puzzle of the week" available from the Maths team. Trinity Absence Procedures

If you know your child will not be attending school on any day, please contact the School by 8am in the morning.

Failure to inform the school of any absence will result in the absence being unauthorised.

As part of our commitment to improving the attainment of our pupils we monitor pupil attendance on a regular basis.

For pupils who have continued absence due to illness or medical appointments, an absence will not be authorised unless medical evidence is produced on their return to school.

Evidence can be in the form of a GP's letter, an appointment card, a prescription for medication or even the container medication has been supplied in. Just bring evidence into school and it will be noted.

The difference between Authorised and Unauthorised Absence

In short, there is no difference.

If a pupil has a medical appointment or goes on holiday or is off for any other exceptional circumstance, even if these absences are authorised by the Headteacher, they still go against a pupil's attendance percentage as they are physically not in school.

A Headteacher can only grant authorisation in very exceptional circumstances. If authorisation is not granted the pupil will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Although sometimes difficult, parents should endeavour to make medical appointments outside of school hours, and take holidays outside of term time too.

Persistent Absentees

Letters will be sent home for persistent absence, and the Local Authority can issue a Penalty Notice. A pupil that has 2 sessions off (1 day) will automatically become a Persistent Absentee pupil as their attendance will drop below 90% if they are absent for a further session. For further information please do not hesitate to contact the school.

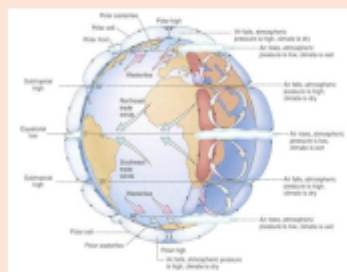

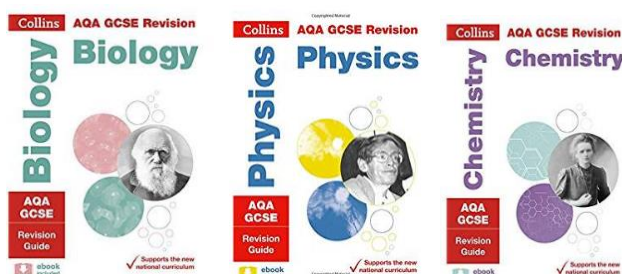
REMINDER

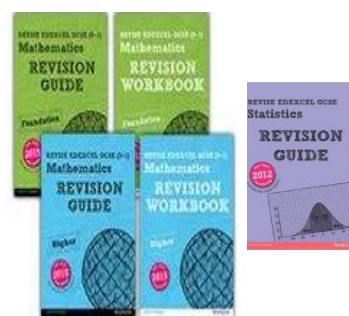
