I wish to thank you for your full support this first half term of the new Academic Year. The seven weeks have flown by and the pupils have achieved so much. During this time we have our Year 11 PPE (Pre Public Exams – Mock exams), Year 10 have 2 weeks on work experience, Staff training, assessment weeks for all our year groups and all our Christmas events. A very busy time ahead.

New Knowledge Organisers will be issued to pupils on the first day back after half term. 

NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM


