



# ALLERGIES & ASTHMA & MORE



## DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE ALLERGIES?

*Has your child been prescribed an Auto-injector/Epipen !*

*Do you ensure your child carries one with them at all times!*

*With trips and off-site visits it is imperative that your child carries their prescribed auto-injector/Epipen with them at all times.*

*If newly prescribed to your child – please let us know too!*

**EpiPen/Auto-injectors are used to treat severe allergic reactions (anaphylaxis) to insect stings or bites, foods, drugs and other allergens**

Anaphylaxis is a severe and life-threatening allergic reaction – it can be fatal if treatment is not given quickly. The adrenaline auto-injectors should be used in an emergency whilst waiting for medical help.

## Manage your child's asthma well

### Does your child suffer from Asthma !

Recently the law was changed permitting schools to now have generic asthma pumps available at school for pupils to use should their own be lost, empty or not to hand.

Trinity complies and for pupils at school and on the premises we could, in an emergency provide an inhaler to those that are registered at the school as asthmatic.

However for school trips, journeys to and from home and off site activities **PLEASE** ask your child/ren to ensure they have their own inhalers ready to use and on them at all times. Asthma attacks are very dangerous.

**PLEASE DO NOT RELY ON THE SCHOOL TO PROVIDE INHALERS FOR YOUR CHILD**

A collection of contemporary art, inspired by and based upon the work of British Artist, Laurence Stephen Lowry.


